

Wildfire Preparedness Tips:

100' DEFENSIBLE SPACE

- ◆ A Defensible Space of 100 feet is required by law ¹.

Zone 1:

- ◆ Clear an area of 30 feet immediately surrounding your home

Zone 2:

- ◆ Create horizontal spacing between shrubs and trees.
- ◆ Create vertical spacing between grass, shrubs and trees.



Wildfire Action Plan

Create an evacuation plan that includes:

- ◆ A designated emergency meeting location outside the fire or hazard area. This is critical to determine who has safely evacuated from the affected area.
- ◆ Several different escape routes from your home and community. Practice these often so everyone in your family is familiar in case of emergency.
- ◆ Have an evacuation plan for pets and large animals such as horses and other livestock.

Stay In Contact

- ◆ If you evacuate, notify your out-of-area contact to give them a status update. Let them know what route you're taking and where you are planning to go. Provide updates as routes and plans change.

REMEMBER THE SIX "P's"

KEEP THESE SIX "P's" READY IN CASE IMMEDIATE EVACUATION IS REQUIRED:

- People and pets
- Papers, phone numbers, & important documents
- Prescriptions, vitamins, and eyeglasses
- Pictures and irreplaceable memorabilia
- Personal computer hard drive and disks
- "Plastic" (credit cards, ATM cards) and cash
