Objective Statement #1 – The Legislation Committee will ensure proposed language changes are consistent with recommendations from the State DVBE program audit report.

Progress on Objective #1 – There are no bills currently alive that address issues raised by the State DVBE program audit. AB 1218 (Weber) is on suspense in the Senate Appropriations and SB 159 (Nielsen) failed to clear its second policy committee in the Senate.

Mission Statement

To provide California's DVBE community a forum to propose, examine, and recommend legislation impacting the DVBE program.

Completed

Objective Statement - The Legislation Committee will pursue change to Military & Veterans Code (M & VC) Section 999 (b)(7)(B) by recommending the deletion of "and solely for purposes of any contract entered into before that death or certification of a permanent medical disability."

Background: M& VC Section 999 (b)(7)(B) – Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), after the death or the certification of a permanent medical disability of a disabled veteran who is a majority owner of a business that qualified as a DVBE prior to that death or certification of a permanent medical disability, and solely for purposes of any contract entered into before that death or certification, that business shall be deemed to be a DVBE for a period not to exceed three years after the date of that death or certification of a permanent medical disability, if the business is inherited or controlled by the spouse or child of that majority owner, or by both of these persons.

Progress on Objective Statement – The Legislature unanimously passed AB 413 (Chavez) which Governor Brown signed on October 6, and will become law on January 1, 2016, Chaptered by Secretary of State on October 6, Chapter 513, Statutes of 2015.
