

What is a Notice of Suspension?

A Notice of Suspension (Suspension) is a temporary order served on a school when the school and/or its programs are in violation of the standards or requirements for a grant of California State Approving Agency for Veterans Education (CSAAVE) approval.

How long does a Suspension last?

A Suspension is issued for sixty days and prevents the school from enrolling any new students.

How does a Suspension affect the school?

During the suspension period, the school may continue to offer approved programs and certify the enrollment of all currently enrolled students.

What does the school need to do to resolve the Suspension?

The school must fully comply with the Suspension, by correcting all cited discrepancies and demonstrate compliance with the standards and/or requirements for approval.

What happens if the school does not resolve the Suspension?

If the school is unable to demonstrate compliance, all programs previously approved by CSAAVE will be disapproved.

How does a Suspension affect students?

The Suspension affects new students and does not affect continuously enrolled students.

How does a Suspension affect VA basic housing allowance (BAH)?

During the Suspension period there is no change to the amount of BAH that VA pays to continuously enrolled students.

What happens to education benefits if a school does not resolve a Suspension?

Students may be unable to be paid for their enrollment at the school. To find out if the VA will continue to pay for your enrollment, contact VA at:
